1) Learning (Hull Children's Trust) Meeting Updates

a) Comprehensive Area Assessment (CAA):

An update was given to the Hull Children's Trust regarding the outcomes of the 2009 CAA and activity planned for the 2010 CAA.

With regards to the City's learning theme, the outcomes of the CAA were positive, with the report stating that "the prospects for nearly all children, including children in the care of Hull City Council and those in poorer families, are improving".

The report also highlighted the fact that Hull had achieved its highest ever GCSE results during 2009. During 2010, the CAA will be looking at the sustainability of these results and the plans that have been put in place to ensure continuous improvement.

b) Strategic Investment Group (SIG):

An update was given on the progress of the Strategic Investment Group, a group that has been set up to look at using different funding streams to tackle learning priorities as set by the Hull Children's Trust.

The group has been asked by the Board to prepare a business case for WNF funding. The business case will be submitted to the ONE HULL Executive Group for consideration.

c) Third Tier Review

The Children's Trust is currently reviewing their Third Tier arrangements – the partnership arrangements that sit under the 6 Every Child Matters outcomes.

This process forms part of the governance review of the Trust and will help to put in place the structures to ensure that delivery of outcomes across the partnership are as effective and efficient as possible.

The Trust is working with the ONE HULL Executive Team to ensure that their approach is consistent and compatible with the restructure of the ONE HULL Health and Well-being Strategic Delivery Partnership (SDP) (see OH Update Issue 1 2010).

d) Children and Young People's Plan (CYPP)

An update was given on the progress of the new CYPP – a plan that sets out how partners will be working to improve the lives of children and young people in Hull.

The new Plan will cover the period from 2010 to 2013. The draft report will be tabled at the next Hull Children's Trust (HCT) Board. The final CYPP is expected by the end of April and will include a children and young people's version (to be published over the summer) and a web-based version.

The voluntary and community sector held a workshop on the CYPP in January 2010, where the priorities were discussed and consulted on.

There has also been wide consultation on the CYPP priorities through the HCT Board and Website, meetings with and presentations to various multi-agency groups, as well as a written survey with children and young people. These consultations on the priorities for the Plan are now coming to an end and the new draft priorities are available on the HCT Website.

However, wider consultation on the draft full Plan is still ongoing and will continue until mid-April. Copies of the draft Plan are being circulated to many interested parties identified in legislation and statutory guidance; it will be made available for comment shortly on the HCT Website.

3) Youth Centre Funding

Hull City Council has been awarded £5 million from the Big Lottery MyPlace fund to build a

youth facility on the former nightclub Lexington Avenue, in the city centre.

Plans for the five-story building includes a large performing arts space, a recording studio, sports facilities, a dance space, as well as a chill out zone and outdoor activity space. The proposals also include a learning area and support services for young people; it is hoped that the venue will host a wide range of events.

It is believed that the site could be finished by mid-2011.
