1) ONE HULL News

a) Executive Group (EG) Round-up

City Plan: A representative from each of the four Strategic Delivery Partnerships (SDPs) presented to the Group outlining the main challenges facing the City in the coming years with respect to their key target audiences and what impact, as a result of partnership activity, can be made.

A clear set of priorities and outcomes, broadly drawn from the presentations, will be included in a draft City Plan to be presented to the next meeting.

CYP Plan: The Group endorsed the Hull 2013: Children and Young People's Plan (CYP) and noted the Hull Children's Flood Project and ONE Children's Workforce Framework.

Rainforest Project: Natasha Banke of the Humber Education Business Partnership gave a presentation on the Hull Schools' Rainforest Project. The aim is to acquire virgin rainforest in the Maquipucuna Reserve in Ecuador and enhance pupils' learning about conservation by helping to preserve the rain and cloud forest by acquiring approximately 100 hectares of land – about the size of Hull – forever.

- The project already includes the University of Hull and its current PGCE (Post Graduate Certificate in Education) Students
- It is expected that all Hull Schools will participate
- 12 pupils will be visiting the forest in the future
- The project will help organic cropping in the forest
- Can be used by organisations to offset carbon use

The project seeks the right to use the ONE HULL brand and is seeking support and finance across the city and elsewhere. Work is to continue with the Communications and Environment and Climate Change Leads.

UNCONFIRMED Minutes of the EG meeting will be placed on the ONE HULL Website when they have been agreed prior to ratification.

b) Big Society

ONE HULL has been working in partnership with the Institute of Community Cohesion (ICoCo) to develop a specific piece of work around the potential impact of the Big Society on Hull and to identify areas for future development.

ICoCo has spent time in Hull to carry out a focused assessment looking at:

- What the Big Society mean for Hull?
- What exists already that fits into the Big Society vision?
- What will need to be done to make the Big Society successful and meaningful?
- What infrastructure support is available for social enterprise development?
- What are the blocks and barriers?

These questions helped shape interviews and focus groups. The work will also offer an opportunity to provide feedback into the emerging Government proposals around the Big Society and to identify future areas of support. It will also help to inform the new City Plan.

c) ONE HULL Communications

ONE HULL 2012 Gold - Private Sector Support: In response to potential reductions and ability around public sector communications and budgets, the Communications Lead is investigating private sector support to assist with communications and participation goals, especially around 2012.

Key areas include securing in-kind work to assist with the dissemination of information. The proposals also included an innovative link-up with local colleges covering media, photography and digital media to enable local students and to integrate work experience opportunities and portfolios for future jobs or education by helping to promote the 2012 agenda into the public domain.

ONE HULL Website: The administration area on the ONE HULL Website is to be developed over the coming weeks to provide a greater online document resource library for public, private, voluntary and community partners, as well as local residents.

The work will compliment communications led by Hull City Council's Integrated Information Team and the Children's Trust to ensure consistency in approach and engagement - as well as maximising value for money.

The aim is to highlight the importance given to the right to source good-quality, comprehensive and impartial information, advice, and guidance (IAG) {for children and young people} where better access to information could lead to better outcomes.

ONE HULL Theatre Production: The next phase of work is set to commence on an innovative communications project at Hull Truck tackling the key issues facing the City. Using the medium of theatre, the aim is to encourage young people to look at the paths they take in life, covering the four ONE HULL themes, and to inspire young people on the start of their academic journey that the only thing holding them back was themselves.

In addition, work continues to look at the sustainability of the project through private

sponsorship, which could be advantageous for future events, such as a City of Culture bid for example, especially if the project enables, as planned, 700 Year Seven pupil in the City an opportunity to share in the City's continued renaissance. Work also continues with the Children's Trust around logistics and support.

2) Round the Themes SDP Updates

a) Earning

Public Spending: The Earning SDP continues to develop the Social Clauses and Supply Chains' work-stream which seeks to maximise the opportunities for local businesses as a result of public sector spending and contract awards.

Employment and Skills Sub Board: The Sub-board is making good progress and is now chaired by the Helen Roberts Human Resources Director at KC.

The group has developed an Employment & Skills Plan containing 5 key objectives. Individual leads for these objectives are to be agreed at the next meeting.

A review of business requirements will also be carried out in order to ensure that delivery against the identified objectives will be consistent with business requirements. This will be done at no cost by combining existing intelligence through desk top research and utilising KC's employer and H.R. Director's network.

Employment and Skills Sub Board: The Sub-board is now chaired by Martin Shaw Managing Director at the D3 Office Group.

Although an Enterprise strategy has not yet been completed due to uncertainties around the emerging Local Enterprise Partnership (LEP), the Board has already identified some priority areas of work, such as business mentoring.

How the group takes these forward is an agenda item for the next meeting. The group will also be discussing local business support requirements for the City which will inform and coordinate future working arrangements.

General Updates:

- Partners received an update on the now completed 14-19 plan which forms a critical part of the Earning SDP's agenda.

b) Learning (Hull Children's Trust)

The Children and Young People's Plan (CYPP): The CYPP, which sets out the priorities for the Children's Trust Board for the next three years, has been widely distributed.

A PDF version is available on the Hull Children's Trust website www.hullchildrenstrust.org with additional hard copies available from the Children's Trust Board Manager.

SDP linkages: The SDP was consulted on the progress made with the Health & Wellbeing SDP and asked to agree the proposed linkages between the two.

In order to establish strong linkages between the two SDPs, the membership of the new Health & Wellbeing SDP includes the Vice Chair of the Children's Trust and it is proposed that all health and wellbeing issues relating to children, young people and families are led

by her and routed through the Children's Trust.

Annual Progress Report: The Annual Progress Report which looks at our progress towards achieving the priorities in the Hull Children's Trust Children and Young People's Plan is now available on the Trust website.

Commissioning Strategy: The Commissioning Strategy, which is part of a suite of documents that supports the delivery of the 2010 – 2013 Children and Young People's Plan (CYPP) will be available shortly.

The Strategy, which supports the next three-year CYPP demonstrating the combined collective investment of partners, will also identify gaps in provision and funding.

General Updates:

- The Strategic Investment Group has set itself a work plan consisting of three strategic priorities which help support the work of the board in delivering the priorities within the C&YPP.
- The national context continues to change as partners await the outcome of the Public Spending Review in October, which will shape the delivery of services. The Trust awaits further national direction and clarification; meanwhile, work continues building on positive relationships and strong partnership working.
- The Learning SDP (Children's Trust) received a presentation on impact the floods had on children and young People in Hull including health, education, environmental issues and emotional wellbeing.
- The SDP was given a presentation on the extensive work done in bringing together all the information on activities for children, young people and their families and the work being done to ensure that this is communicated across the city through All Clued Up and Plings led by the Integrated Information Management Team.
- Two members of Hull's Youth Parliament, who have been selected to represent Hull in the National Youth Parliament, have presented their manifestos to the SDP. They expressed their desires to act as ambassadors for the City and asked partners to provide good news stories and positive messages they could take with them to the next meeting.

c) Health and Wellbeing

Membership and Subgroups: Much work has been done with the with the new Chair, Ian Blakey over the past months in preparation for the launch of the new Health & Wellbeing SDP

The SDP met for the first time on September 01 and is addressing the Health & Wellbeing agenda through six routes:

- Healthy Lifestyles
- Adults and Older People
- Housing
- Children & Young People
- Mental Health
- VCS

Headline outcomes deliverable within the current financial year has been set for each of the themes and progress against these will be reviewed at the end of the financial year.

d) Safe

DAP: The Hull Domestic Abuse Partnership (DAP) is currently reviewing its operational arrangements and financial support.

The DAP co-ordinates, facilitates and delivers a multi-agency response to tackling domestic violence. In order to meet the current demand for its services it is seeking additional £150k per annum. DAP services are to be put forward as a potential Total Place pilot scheme.

General Updates:

- The SDP discussed the ONE HULL Environment & Climate Change Strategy and how partners could benefit from and contribute to the aims and objectives.
- Partners received an update on the performance of the Hull Youth Offending Team who reported that fewer children are entering the criminal justice system and re-offending rates have fallen. More young people who complete their work with the Youth Justice Service are living in suitable accommodation and/or are in full time education.

Equalities and Cohesion (E&C)

iCoCo: Following the iCoCo Development Programme module on 'Tension Management', the ONE HULL Safe Partnership has agreed to take overall ownership of both the governance arrangements (including extending its information sharing protocols to cover community tension information) and accountability for an annual tension management plan. The new Tension Management sub group will meet monthly.

Migration Impact Fund: There will be no further funding of this nature in the foreseeable future; however, the projects already commissioned will provide case studies that may help to cost-effective ways to manage future spend on migration related issues.

Transport Issues: The Transport Sub-Board raised concerns about the immediate future of sustainable travel in the city due to the current and future financial restraints. In particular there were possible issues about transport.

- Joanne Pollard of CO2 Sense gave a presentation on Sustainable Buildings and a need to join thinking, planning and activity together. CO2 Sense has produced a green product and services guide.
- There was also interest in modular building which might be used to develop industries based on caravan skills with less susceptibility to seasonal variation.

This involvement has been around ensuring that the framework is fully COMPACT compliant and highlights any implications for the reduction in or ending of existing contracts.

The Forum hosted an information sharing session around the possible impact of the Spending Review, which was attended by a broad cross section of groups and organisations.

General Updates:

- Work continues around developing the relationship between the voluntary and community sector and NHS Hull. The focus is now moving towards engagement at an Area level.
